Four Year Planning Guide for Lynden High School

Students attending Lynden High School take 8 classes per semester. When students earn a passing grade, they are awarded 0.5 credits for each semester class. Some classes continue for a full year – however, each semester's credit is earned and awarded separately. Students need to earn a minimum of 29 credits in specific subject areas in order to graduate. Those areas and possible course options are outlined below.
