Local FBLA Members Qualify for National Competition

Gold Seal & Outstanding Chapter Honors

The Lynden FBLA chapter made it a priority to work towards earning the recognition of being a Champion Chapter. This is a national competition in which FBLA members are given a huge list of activities to plan, execute, record, reflect on, and submit evidence of completion.

They started in August of 2022 with fundraising, officer training, and community service

planning--to name a few projects--and continued until they competed this last weekend at The Davenport Grand Hotel in Spokane. Lynden was one of ten high schools recognized for their Champion Chapter work in their respective communities. Of these ten exceptional chapters, Lynden FBLA was awarded the top prize as Outstanding Local Chapter of the Year for Washington State for exceeding the criteria for every metric tracked by FBLA.
