- Lynden High School received the results of the Avant Assessment for World Language Proficiency. We have 20 students who earned a total of 65 college credits for their achievement of the STAMP test! We now have a total of 4 students who will earn the Seal of Biliteracy at graduation. The STAMP test assesses reading, writing, listening and speaking in a student's native language.
- Lynden High School Teacher, Jody Bagues is doing some amazing things with her new entrepreneur class. She has developed her own product, opened an etsy store, and started marketing it to show her students how the process works and go through the process as she is teaching them. Her students have to come up with a product or service, develop a business plan, and figure out how to market. Two of her students have created small businesses that they will implement moving forward.
- Lynden High School is taking 60 students to the Whatcom Business Alliance Youth Engagement kick-off at BTC Students will participate in discussions with four local business leaders who will introduce the students to some career opportunities in Whatcom County. This is also a partnership with Junior Achievement who has developed a Job Shadow curriculum.
- Isom, in coordination with LHS Honor Society student Sanjina Bawa, ran a successful clothing drive over the last few weeks. They collected 3,865 articles of clothing to donate to those in need this winter!
- Coach Roper along with players from the boys and girls basketball teams and cheerleaders visited Bernice Vossbeck Elementary to present an Assembly on Teamwork and Sportsmanship to all 3rd-5th grade students.
- Bernice Vossbeck is excited to host trainer Shannon Sinclair for their 3rd Best Practices Professional Development.
- Lynden Academy is proud of one of their students who came back to school for one class to graduate! She has a graduation certificate and is ready to go.
- After doing a "No Late Homework Month", Lynden Academy is excited to report that over 60% of students 7th-12th grade were able to get their homework in on time. The students didn't realize that Dairy Queen donated free blizzards to the school for this incentive and 47 students received these certificates at the end of the semester!
