- A group of Lynden Middle Schools students attended the Fall Leadership Days Conference on October 6th at Nooksack Middle School where they got the chance to meet student leaders from the other schools and plan for ways to promote belonging and community.
- Lynden High School hosted its 13th annual College & Career Fair. Students from Lynden and neighboring high schools enjoyed an introduction to a variety of future possibilities from over 55 representatives from various post-secondary options including 4-year private and public colleges, community colleges, technical colleges, military services, local public safety offices, apprenticeships, and multiple local businesses.
- 7th Grade students at Lynden Middle School explored engineering by making rockets!
- First graders at Isom Elementary attended their first "in house" field trip as an extension of a CKLA knowledge unit on the digestive system. They toured their school building presented as a human body. The use of interactive lessons created an exceptional learning experience for students.
- Athletes from Lynden High School took their annual fall trip to the three elementary schools to spend time with students during lunch and recess. The event serves as a way to connect grades across Lynden Schools.

The Board president may interrupt or terminate an individual's statement when it is too lengthy, personally directed, irrelevant, or abusive. The Board as a whole has the final decision on such matters. Complaints concerning District employees or other individuals may not be addressed orally at the meeting. Such complaints must be signed and presented to the Board in writing. Executive session may then be granted for a hearing. Questions or concerns about instructional practices or materials should be directed to the superintendent for appropriate referral.
