- 4th Corner Theater was nominated by Lynden Schools for a WASA Community Partnership Award and honored during an awards luncheon held on May 16, 2025. This award recognizes community members or groups for their outstanding contributions toward educational experiences. 4th Corner Theater group has served as a booster of the Lynden Schools drama department for many years to help provide supplies, theater camps, and fund community performance to help enrich the experiences of students involved in the performing arts.
- The Lynden Fire Department visited Lynden High School health classes to teach life-saving CPR and AED (automated external defibrillator) skills to students.
- Spring sports have come to end with another successful season by Lynden athletes. In girls tennis, Hailey and Avery Brooks won the 2A State doubles championship and singles player Rilanna Newcomb placed fourth. Combined the team earned second in state. In boys golf, Jack Stapleton placed sixth and in girls golf, Kinsley Rector finished 14th and Lucy Jones finished 38th. The fastpitch team went 3-2 in the state tournament. Track and Field athlete Sloan Dickson won state in both the 1,600-meter and 3,200-meter runs. Lynden girls tied for fourth as a team and were helped by Faith VanBrocklin placing third in the 300 hurdles, Kiki York finishing sixth in the 200 and seventh in the 100, Reta VanderMey earning eighth in the 300 hurdles, the 4x200 relay finishing third and both the 4x100 and 4x400 relays finishing fourth. For the boys, Conrad Timmer was seventh in the long jump, Logan Wilhite tied for eighth in the high jump and both the 4x100 and 4x400 relay teams were sixth.
- Advanced Placement U.S. Government and Politics students at Lynden High School capped off their year with a full-fledged

mock trial at the Whatcom County Courthouse in Bellingham in front of Washington State Superior Court Judge Evan Jones.

- Lynden High School AVID students held a special graduation event. The Advancement via Individual Determination group spends four years of high school on a rigorous path toward graduation and this year's group ended high school with a higher-than-average GPA and attendance rate. A nationwide program offered at Lynden, students apply to join the class that places a focus on helping them develop the skills, strategies and mindset to achieve in their post-high school education path. This group will move toward four-year universities, community college, technical college, apprenticeships, the workforce, and the Marines and Air Force academy for next year.
- It's been a season of celebration at Lynden Academy! Over the last two weeks, they've had the joy of honoring their 5th graders as they prepare for middle school, their 8th graders as they transition into high school, and- most memorably- watching their 28 seniors walk across the graduation stage.
- Lynden High School celebrated 201 graduates during their graduation ceremony on June 6th. The graduating class included 6 valedictorians and 23 seniors who received a Seal of Biliteracy. The week also included a Grad Walk that provided seniors an opportunity to visit their former elementary school and walk the halls in their cap & gown. Congratulations to the Class of 2025!
- Elementary 4th graders recently completed an impressive state research project and shared their presentations with families and fellow students. Their hard work and enthusiasm were on full display!
- All three elementary schools will be hosting their annual end-of-the-year Field Day for students and an evening for families featuring games, bouncy houses, food trucks, and exciting activities. This is a much-loved tradition for our elementary families. They will also end the year with celebration events for their kindergarteners and 5th graders- marking meaningful milestones as they transition to their next learning adventures. We are so proud of our youngest learners!
