
Board Self-Assessment

Annually, the board will assess its own performance in terms of generally accepted principles of successful board operations, in relation to its annual goals and objectives, and Washington State School Board Standards. The board self-assessment will address performance in the key functions of school boards:

- A. Responsible school district governance;
- B. Communication of and commitment to high expectations for student learning;
- C. Creating conditions district-wide for student and staff success;
- D. Holding the district accountable for student learning; and
- E. Engagement of the community in education.

The results of the self-assessment will be reviewed and discussed by the board-superintendent team and used in setting goals for the subsequent year.
